A few days later we made arrangements with the marina in Homestead and returned home.

We realized at that point that we would need to secure someone to bring the vessel to Savannah. Keith McFarlane and Terry Hatt began doing repairs and alternating times staying on the vessel until it was ready to resume its journey to Savannah. But even before it reached its destination we had the opportunity to lend it to a youth mission organization for a week. (That is another story that will be submitted by those involved, perhaps in the next Shipmate).

When we felt led to accept the donated vessel we weren't sure why, nor do we know at this time. But we felt and feel, that it has a divine purpose in God's Kingdom, and will be instrumental in the fulfillment of God's plan concerning his prophetic declarations of the days that we are now living in and all that is to come. *He who has ears to hear let him hear.*

Hey Captain

or coastal and inland waters we have some great tools available for getting a feel for the weather that we will experience in the near future. The Marine weather forecast on the radio is a great place to start and it is available on websites as well. A phone app like WeatherBug or The Weather Channel will also give you nice hour by hour detail. The radar on these apps is good enough to convince me to stop paying for a service to show weather on my chart plotter.

I use the phone app SailFlow routinely. SailFlow predicts wind direction and velocity for every 3 hours. You can select different forecasting models to see what others are predicting or just use one that seems to be best for your area. The graphics make it real easy to get a feel for the opportunities ahead. I always check SailFlow when I am selecting an anchorage for the night.

Traditionally one of the very first things you did when you got on board was tap on the side of the barometer. A tap in just the right place would jostle the needle enough to get the current barometric pressure. Then a few hours later you could go back tap the side again and see if the pressure was going up or down and how fast. Now for way less money (<\$80) than a good barometer you can get an electronic barometer. The pressure

history for the last few hours is plotted out and may have alarms, time, temperature and other handy information.

No matter how optimistic the data is, keeping an eye on the sky is always essential. With experience the clouds tell you a lot and localized thunderstorms usually give you just enough prep time so you can enjoy the ferocity when it hits. Studying weather and having your own personal plan for storm preparation are well worth the time.

As you monitor the marine radio you may get information of changing weather conditions and special broadcast. If water spouts are developing you might hear some chatter on the radio. My experience indicates that when conditions are right for waterspouts you may see wind devils tossing and swirling the spray from white caps.

One other site I monitor is "greatlakesonline. nos.noaa.gov". This web site gives the history of water levels on Lake Erie. Levels can change 3 to 6 feet in less than six hours when the wind blows or stops blowing. The Coastal Pilot says the record change on the east end is 3 meters. If our plan is to slip into an anchorage that is a little thin changes in water level can make or break our plans.
